Pre-School Room

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Things to do at home this month

Pre-School

The children will be reading the story "Hello Beaky", a story of a bird that hatches out of an egg and embarks on a journey to find out what kind of creature he is.

We will also be continuing to learn about Spring. At home you can look for the signs of Spring such as blossom on the trees or Spring flowers. You could also ask them to talk about the weather and what it is doing today.

You could bake Easter nest buns and develop your child's mathematical skills using language such as more or less.

Toddler room

The Toddlers will be learning about "The Ugly Duckling" story. You could extend their learning by talking about ducks and their babies, going out for a walk looking for nests and looking for any ducks and ducklings on the ponds.

You can develop maths skills by making Easter nest buns and using language such as more and less and grams when measuring the ingredients.

Baby Room

The Babies are singing "Twinkle Twinkle Little Star" throughout April.

We will be learning about Transport. You could extend your child's learning at home through activities such as talking about the different colours of cars you can see or how many cars there are, counting up to five.

You could sing "The wheels on the bus" and pretend to go on a bus. Develop your child's imagination skills by playing with cars or trains and talking about the noises the vehicles make.
