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Things to do at home this month

Pre-School

The children in the pre school room are reading the book "Tiddler" by Julia Donaldson and learning about under the sea. You could support your child's learning at home by looking in a book or even looking on the Internet, to find out about an animal that lives under the sea. Singing the song 1,2,3,4,5...

Ask questions about the story Tiddler, such as which is your favourite character? Or asking your child to retell the story to you.

You could ask which their favourite part of the story is?

Toddler room

The children in the toddler room are reading the book The Gruffalo by Julia Donaldson . You could talk to your child about the story and ask them questions such as what sound does a snake make? Ask them to identify which animal is flying?

You could sing our nursery rhyme of the month

Five Little Ducks.

Baby Room

The children in the baby room are singing Five Little Ducks for their song of the month. You could sing the song at home and add props such as bath ducks if you have them. Count the ducks to encourage number recognition.

1, 2, 3, 4, 5, Once I Caught a Fish Alive

One, Two, Three, Four, Five, Once I caught a fish alive.

Six, Seven, Eight, Nine, Ten, Then I threw him back again.

Why did you let him go? Because he bit my finger so.

Which finger did he bite? This little finger on my right.
