#### Pre-School Room

In the pre school room we have been very busy learning about Colours and Sounds as well as Diwali and Bonfire night. We have explored how colours can be mixed and changed and used them to make different patterns and pictures of fireworks.

We have listened to sounds and made our own sounds with musical instruments. We learnt all about Diwali, the festival of light. We made henna hands and rangoli patterns using bright colours and talked about the meaning of them.

We explored colours in nature, identifying the colours that Autumn brings. We made our own brightly coloured leaf paintings, made autumn soup in the mud kitchen and enjoyed stories around the campfire.

#### Christmas Party.

Our children's Christmas party is scheduled to take place on Friday 15th December at 2pm at the nursery and will finish at 4pm. If your child does not attend that day they will need to dropped off at nursery at 2pm and collected by 4pm. There will be party food, games and lots of fun! #### **Toddler Room**

The toddlers have been exploring colours and sounds. We made our own rainbows, sang colour songs and learnt new colour names. We developed our fine motor skills by exploring the rainbow playdough. We learnt about Diwali through exploration of light and colour.

We learnt about sounds by making our own musical instruments and listening out for different sounds in the environment.

#### Baby Room.

The baby room have been exploring autumn and bonfire night through sensory exploration. We have made hedgehog bread and read "That's not my hedgehog".

We have made Autumn soup with natural materials out in the garden and jumped and splashed in the muddy puddles. We have further explored our senses through scented playdough, scented porridge play and lights in the dark den.

### Things to do at home this month

#### Pre-School

The children in the Pre school room are going to be taking part in lots of Christmas activities. You can extend your child's learning at home through taking part in activities such as writing a Christmas list for Father Christmas and encouraging your child to draw pictures. You could read Christmas stories and encourage your child to talk about the story including about the characters and your child's favourite part. You can talk about kindness at Christmas and about giving and how we can be kind to others.

#### Toddler room

The children are going to be taking part n Christmas activities and reading the story "That's not my Reindeer". At home you can encourage your child to draw on Christmas cards and develop their emerging writing skills. You can bake gingerbread biscuits; baking activities help to develop many learning skills including mathematics through weighing, measuring and time, Understanding the World through understanding changes when baking the mixture and physical development by using tools to mix the ingredients. We have been learning and singing lots of Christmas songs, join in at home and develop your child's language skills.

#### **Baby Room**

The children in the baby room are going to be exploring Christmas and developing their Communication and Language Skills. You can do this at home by singing Christmas songs and looking at Christmas books talking about the pictures. You could also make a sensory bin using baubles, tinsel and other Christmas's items and develop your child's sensory skills and introduce new vocabulary. You could make gloop using corn flour and water and add scents such as ginger to it.
