Pre-School Room

In the pre school room we have been very busy learning about colours and light and dark by creating dark dens outside. We have also done some shadow drawing using torches and exploring how shadows are created. We celebrated Bonfire Night creating firework pictures, we also made smores and hot chocolate on the campfire. We took part in a science experiment using a sparkler in a potato. The sparkler lit up the potato which the children thought was magic!

We also celebrated Diwali through creating Rangoli patterns and creating Henna hands. This helps our Understanding of the World and British Values through learning about different cultures.

We also enjoyed learning about mixing colours through mixing paint on the tuff tray.

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Things to do at home this month

Pre-School

The children in the Pre-school room are going to be taking part in Christmas Activities. You can extend your child's learning at home through taking part in activities such as writing a Christmas list for Father Christmas and encouraging your child to draw pictures. You can also read Christmas stories and encourage your child to talk about the story, including talking about the characters and your child's favourite part.

You could talk about kindness at Christmas, about giving to others and how we can be kind to others.

Toddler room

The children are going to be taking part in Christmas activities and reading the story "That's not my Reindeer". At home you could encourage your to draw on Christmas cards and develop their emergent writing skills. You could bake gingerbread biscuits. Baking activities help to develop many learning skills including mathematics, through weighing, measuring and timing. Understanding the World, through understanding changes when baking the mixture and physical development by using tools to mix the mixture.

We have been learning and singing lots of Christmas songs you can join in at home and develop your child's language skills.

Baby Room

The children in the baby room are going to be exploring Christmas and developing their Communication and Language Skills. You could do this at home by singing Christmas songs and looking at Christmas books, talking about the pictures. You could also make a sensory bin using baubles, tinsel and other Christmas's items to develop your child's sensory skills and introduce new vocabulary. You could also make gloop using corn flour and water and add scents such as ginger to it.

Christmas playdough recipe.

2 cups flour

2 tablespoons vegetable oil

1/2 cup salt

2 tablespoons cream of tartar

Up to 1.5 cups boiling water (adding in increments until it feels just right)

1 teaspoon mint extract.

Mix all together and enjoy!
