Things to do at home this month

Pre-School

The children in the pre school room are reading the book "The Gruffalo's Child". You could read the story at home and talk about the different characters as well as talking about the rhyming words in the story. Encourage your child's listening skills by missing a word out and see if they can fill the gap. We are also learning about Winter, you can talk about the weather and examine items covered in frost. You can go for a walk and look at the changes to the trees and environment during the Winter. Make a vegetable soup and encourage your child to help prepare the vegetables talking about them being cut in half or quarters. It's the RSPB's Big Bird Watch during January, so why not look for different birds in the garden and even make some bird feeders for them and talk about caring for animals during winter.

Toddler room

The children are reading "The Stick Man" story by Julia Donaldson. You can talk about the different seasons in the story and the differences between them. When reading the story talk about how your child would feel if they were lost and talk about how the characters are feeling. You can also talk about the trees outside and what they look like without any leaves on. Collect some sticks and make your own stickman.

Baby Room

The children in the babies are singing "Five Little Ducks" and the words are below. You could encourage the children to show you the actions and ask what number comes next? What noise does a duck make?

You can also look at books of farm animals and talk about the different noises that the animals make. You can add toy ducks to bathtime and introduce counting by counting the ducks.
