Pre-School Room

The children in the Pre School enjoyed learning about Christmas throughout December. They had fun making lots of Christmassy things both inside and outside. The children enjoyed developing their mathematical skills by making patterns in the tuff tray and by baking lots of Christmas buns and biscuits, measuring out the ingredients. They made snowflakes and developed their fine motor skills through using scissors to make snips. They also enjoyed playing with different scented playdough such as candy cane playdough and Christmas spice playdough. They have used their measuring skills to wrap presents in the Christmas Post Office.

They have been singing Christmas rhymes and looking at touch and feel Christmas books such as "That's not my Reindeer".

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Things to do at home this month

Pre-School

The children in Preschool will be reading "Foxes in the Snow". Hopefully we get some snow too! You can talk about foxes and what type of habitat they live in. You could create your own pictures of foxes using fluffy materials.

We are learning about Winter, so you could talk about the weather and examine items covered in frost. You can go for walks and look at the changes to the trees and environment during the Winter. You could make a vegetable soup and encourage your child to help prepare the vegetables talking about them being cut in half or quarters.

It's the RSPB's Big Bird Watch during January so why not look for different birds in the garden. You could even make some bird feeders for them and talk about caring for animals during winter.

Toddler room

The children in Toddler room are reading the book "The Gruffalo's Child". You can read the story at home and talk about the different characters as well as talking about the rhyming words in the story. Encourage your child's listening skills by missing a word out and see if they can fill the gap.

You could take a walk out into the woods and see the changes in the environment and talk about where the Gruffalo and the other animals in the story live.

Collect some materials from the woods and bring them in for our Gruffalo story sack.

Baby Room

The children in baby room will be singing "Baa Baa Black Sheep".

Why not sing this at home and maybe introduce some finger or sock puppets for the sheep. Puppets are a great way to develop hand eye coordination.

You can make a story sack with pictures of sheep or use small world models.

Alternatively, why not make your own fluffy sheep with some cotton wool, a great opportunity for sensory exploration.
