#### Pre-School Room

### Things to do at home this month

#### Pre-School

The Pre school will be learning about The Seaside. You could visit the beach (especially if you are oing on holiday) and look for shells and other sea creatures . You could talk about the weather and the type of clothes we need to wear for different types of weather. You could also talk about the journey to the seaside and what transport you have used. You can read the story of "Snail and the Whale" and talk about the journey that the snail goes on. You could go on a picnic and get the children to help prepare the sandwiches and talk about halves and auarters.

#### Toddler room

The children in the Toddler Room will be reading the story "Sharing A Shell". You could extend your child's learning at home by talking about sharing and taking turns. You could also take pictures if you have a trip to the seaside and whilst there you could collect shells and count how many you have collected. Read the story with your child and talk about their favourite character and what they think will happen next.
