#### Pre-School Room

The children in preschool have been learning about minibeasts. They have learnt about the lifecycle of a butterfly and have been learning new vocabulary such as habitat and chrysalis. They have learnt about ladybirds and developed their mathematical skills through counting the spots and talking about symmetry. We have also talked about symmetry when painting butter-fly pictures. We have taken part in a mini beast hunt and used our observational skills to search for them. We have baked mini beasts biscuits and talked about quantity and measuring. For the children going to school we have been practicing recognising and writing our names. We have taken part in activities that develop our listening skills such as games like Simon Says and I Spy.

June we will be resuming closing at 6pm but would again ask all parents to help us at this time and collect your children by ry ready for the next day, ensuring Covid safety, without having to stay late on what are already very long days for them.

The nursery opening time is 8am. We do offer a 7.30am start. The numbers are limited and charged at £4 per session.

#### Toddler Room

The toddlers have been focusing on "The Very Lazy Ladybird". We have enjoyed taking part in a mini beast hunt and looking at where different mini beasts live. We have developed our fine motor skills using tweezers to collect the bugs in our sensory tray. We have used our mathematical skills counting the spots on the ladybirds. We had fun baking butterfly buns and painting butterfly pictures.

The babies have been focusing on Under The Sea. They have enjoyed creating pictures for the board of lovely sea creatures as well as playing in the sand and water and pretending we were at the seaside. We have sung songs and looked at books of sea creatures as well taking part in sensory play with the sea creatures.

### Things to do at home this month

#### Pre-School
