Pre-School Room

The children in preschool have been learning about Sounds. They have taken part in activities that develop their listening and atten-tion skills through taking part in listening walks, matching instru-ments to their sounds and making music. These type of activities develop a child's pre reading skills. Learning to distinguish sounds supports a child's ability to segment words. They have also enjoyed making their own musical instruments and learning about soft and hard sounds. We have enjoyed reading our story of the month "Peace at Last" and talking about the different sounds we hear in different places. We have a new story board that we use to retell the story using story cards. This support and develops our literacy skills.

We have limited availability for our pre and post school sessions for children attending Woodhouse School.

The toddlers have been focusing the story Goldilocks and the Three Bears. We have taken part in activities that develop our physical skills such as making porridge and stirring the porridge oats with the milk. We have also played with the puppets and recreated the story. We have taken part in a Teddy Bears' Breakfast and played with playdough making bears out of the playdough and talking about the size of the bears and introducing mathematical language such as small, medium and large.

The Babies have taken part in activities that develop their sensory skills. They have played with animals in the mud and developed their physical skills. We have also played with coloured spaghetti and introduced new vocabulary such as long, squishy and slimy. We have also enjoyed painting and taking parts in lots of creative activities such as printing with sponges and potatoes.

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Things to do at home this month

Pre-School

The Pre school will be learning about Science and reading the story "My Dad is Brilliant". You can read the story at home and talk about all the things Dad does or Grandad does. You can take part in a baking activity and talk about how the raw ingredients change from soft to hard when cooked. You could talk about temperature and how things freeze when they are cold or boil when hot. Baking is a fabulous way to introduce mathematics by weighing ingredients and talking about more or less.

You could also talk about day and night and talk about shadows. Drawing around shadows is a lovely activity and easy to do and can be done both indoors or out.

Toddler room

The children in the Toddler Room will be reading the story "The Gruffalo". At home you can read the story and talk about the different animals appearing throughout the story. You can also talk about the rhyming words and think of other words that rhyme and develop your child's pre reading skills. You could make a Gruffalos crumble with your child's favourite fruit filling. You have it with Owl Ice cream. You could go for a walk and look for a Gruffalo and talk about where all the animals live that are in the story. You could also talk about feelings and how your child would feel if they saw a Gruffalo.

Baby Room

In the baby room the children are learning about different nursery rhymes. You can do this at home and sing lots of different rhymes with your child and look at books with rhymes in. Singing nursery rhymes is a fantastic way to develop language skills and introduces lots of new vocabulary for your child. You can use playdough to recreate some of the rhymes such as making currant buns with the playdough. This activity supports your child's physical development. By squashing and squeezing the playdough it develops the fine motor skills needed to hold a pencil. It also develops mathematical knowledge through counting and introducing numbers to your child.
