Pre-School Room

The children in pre-school have been learning about different Countries from around the world. They have explored India and enjoyed taking part in making and tasting Indian food. They have also had fun learning about China and the Chinese New Year.

We have also learnt about animals from the rainforest and talked about different habitats where the animals live.

The children enjoyed roleplay in the Valentines Day restaurant and the Indian restaurant. They used their senses playing with the playdough and adding different spices to it such as coriander and ginger.

Toddler Room

The children in the Toddler room have been developing their vocabulary skills through learning new words when exploring about Valentines Day and Chinese New Year.

Things to do at home this month

Pre-School

The children in the Pre school room will be learning about Spring. You can join in at home by going for walks and talking about the signs of Spring, looking at the buds on the trees and the spring flowers. You can draw pictures of the lovely flowers when you get back home talking about the different colours. Look out for the different animals that are being born, such as the ducklings and the lambs, and talk about the different names of the baby animals.

Make Easter Nest Cakes using corn flakes and chocolate and talk about the changes to the chocolate when it melts and sets. Use this as an opportunity to develop mathematical knowledge, talking about quantities and measure the ingredients.

You could also plant seeds for the summer time and talk to your child about how we care for the seeds to help them grow.

Toddler room

The children in the Toddler Room are going to be focusing on the theme Spring. You can join in at home by looking at books of baby animals and talking about the names of the animals and the sounds that they make, supporting your childs language development.

You can also go for a walk and look for the different flowers appearing and talk about the colours of the flowers. Paint pictures of the flowers and talk about mixing different colours together to create new ones.

Bake animal shaped biscuits encouraging your child to help measure out the ingredients and develop their mathematical language.

Talk about the changes that we have start seeing in Spring time such as the leaves growing on the trees.

Baby Room

The Babies are also going to be focusing on Spring and Easter through their sensory development. You can join in at home by making playdough and adding different scents. Whilst playing with the playdough talk about the feel of the playdough and ask questions such as "how does the playdough feel?" and introduce words such as squishy.

You can also go for walks and look for flowers that are growing and for buds appearing on the trees and shrubs.

Paint pictures and name the colours you are using to help develop vocabulary. Painting also helps develop your child's fine motor skills and develops your child's pincer grip that they need to use to hold a pencil correct-ly.

Sugar Cookie Recipe.

Ingredients

100g unsalted butter, softened 100g caster sugar, 2 eggs 1tsp vanilla extract 30g comflour 300g plain flour.

Method. Beat the butter and sugar with an electric whisk for 4 mins until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs, one at a time, then add the vanilla. Whisk in the cornflour and plain flour until the mixture comes together into a dough. Put the dough between two pieces of baking. parchment, and roll out to a 6mm thickness using a rolling pin. Chill for 30 mins. Heat the oven to 200C/180C fan/gas 6. Peel the top layer of parchment off the dough and stamp out circles using a 6cm round cutter (or the shape of your choice). Transfer the cookies to a second large baking sheet lined with baking parchment, spacing them 2cm apart (you may need two sheets). Bake for 7-10 mins. Leave to cool on the sheet for 15 mins, then transfer to a wire rack to cool completely.
