Pre-School Room

The children in preschool have continued learning about Spring. We have learnt about Spring rain and how we make rainbows. We have had lots of fun observing our tadpole which is growing very large now. We celebrated Easter and learnt about Vaisakhi, the Hindu/Sikh solar New Year. We also celebrated St George's Day and discussed why we celebrate it. Learning about different celebrations develops our Under standing of the World knowledge. We have been extended our Literacy skills through our Book of the Month "Hello Beaky" by learning about the structure of the story and by recalling parts of it We have extended our mathematical skills learning the names of different 2D and 3D shapes and recreated them using different construction materials.

Oral Health

Public Health are promoting the importance of keeping your child's teeth healthy especially if you have not managed to get to the dentist due to Covid 19.

We are sharing some tips on how to keep your child's teeth healthy.

1. Brush before bed time and one other time during the day. 2. Use a fluoride toothpaste containing at least 1000 ppm (parts per million). 3. Just a smear on the brush for under 3's. 4. Pea sized amount for over 3's. 5. Spit - don't rinse when finished. 6. Supervise under 8's when brushing 7. Take to the dentist for regular visits. 8. Avoid sugary and acidic food/drinks between meals and an hour before bedtime. 9. Honey, smoothies, fruit juice and dried fruit are not tooth-friendly snacks. 10. Milk is a tooth friendly drink during the day, water is tooth friendly at any time. 11. From 6 months onwards encourage the use of open top cups discourage bottle use after the age of one year. 12. Remember to ask for sugar-free medicines whenever possible.

Toddler Room

The toddlers have been focusing on the ugly ducking, we have had discussions about being a good friend and awareness of others' feelings. We have been exploring duck, chicken and even goose eggs! This allowed the toddlers to make size and weight comparisons! This extended their imaginative skills, as they made predictions about what was in the eggs. We have been exploring the outdoor environment, collecting sticks to make our own nests, digging in the soil and talking about growth and decay. The toddlers have been taking on a role in their play using the vets rolė play.

Baby Room

The babies have been focusing on transport and have taken part in a variety of activities surrounding this. The babies have been exploring cars in different textures, making marks in paint and talking about different forms of transport. They have been listening to the different sounds of transport, singing songs and copying actions.

The babies have shown interest in the outdoor area, using the chalk to mark make and exploring the diggers in sand.

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Things to do at home this month

Pre-School

The Pre school will be learning about mini beasts, you could go for a bug hunt around the garden or whilst on a walk and see how many different bugs you can find, talking about the colours of the insects and how many legs they have. You could make butterfly buns and talk about measurements and following a recipe. You could read the book The Hungry Caterpillar and talk about the days of the week or the different foods they are eating. For our book of the month you could talk about Solomons feelings and also how the other animals are feeling and if they are being kind. You could talk about the different characters in the story and which is your child's favourite. Sing rhymes such as "Incy Wincy Spider" or "There's a worm at the bottom of the garden".

Toddler room

The toddlers are reading "The very lazy ladybird" and learning about minibeasts. You could make Butterfly buns and encourage them to add ingredients and mix them in, talking about the change in the mixture. You could have a mini beast hunt in the garden and see how many different insects you can find, looking at their different colours and shapes.

You can draw and paint pictures of ladybirds.

Sing rhymes such as "Incy Wincy Spider" or "There's a worm at the bottom of the garden".

Baby Room
