#### Pre-School Room

The children in preschool have been learning about Spring. We have developed our physical skills by playing with playdough and making chicks out of it. This activity also develops our mathematical skills through talking about size and how many different body parts we need to add such as how many eyes? We extended this learning by talking about animals on the farm and what there babies are called. We talked about Spring flowers and studied them by drawing real life pictures and taking part in a transient art activity creating flowers using loose parts. We also talked about Easter and had fun taking part in an Easter Egg hunt as well as Egg and Spoon Races. We planted seeds that will hopefully grow into beautiful flowers and talked about how seeds grow.

#### Jubilee Celebrations

We will be celebrating the Queens Platinum Jubilee on Wednesday 1st June by holding Afternoon Tea. We would like to invite your child if they attend that day to dress up in their party clothes to help us celebrate. We have enjoyed messy play and developing our sensory skills by playing in the tuff tray with farm animals as well as with shaving foam and shampoo mixing them together. We have talked about Easter and decorated Easter Eggs and created chick pictures.

The babies have been focusing on the weather. We have had fun playing outside in the sunshine. We enjoyed splashing in the puddles and looking at the flowers. We have taken part in lots of sensory play to develop our physical skills including playing with the animals in the shaving form and coloured rice. We have explored the sand and the mud. We also had lots of fun painting with the body paints and exploring what the paint feels like.

### Things to do at home this month

#### Pre-School

The Pre school will be learning about sounds throughout the month of May. You can take part at home in listening activities, such as going on a walk and listening to the different sounds and identifying them. You can also do this activity indoors, identifying the different sounds you can hear around the house.

Play the game 'I Hear with My Little Ear'. Take it in turns to imitate the sound of something and guess what makes that sound. You could imitate the sounds of things found around your house, like a clock or a telephone, or of recognisable animals such as a cat or dog.

#### Toddler room

The toddlers are reading the story Goldilocks and the Three Bears and you can join in at home by reading the story and talking to your child about their favourite parts of the story. You can ask them to identify the characters such as which one's the Daddy Bear? The story of Goldilocks is a perfect way to introduce the concept of size to your child by talking about the size of the Bears and the chairs. You can also use the story to talk about following the rules and stranger danger. You could also make porridge with for breakfast and add different items to it such as blueberries or honey. You can talk about what your child's favourite breakfast cereal is. You can go for a walk and pretend to be on a Bear Hunt. Look for flowers and identify different types of flowers and what colours they are.

#### **Baby Room**

The baby room are going to be focusing on animals throughout May. You can take part at home and look at books with animals in, such as farm animals and ask your child to point to the animal you name. You can introduce the animal sounds to your child such as "what noise does a sheep make?" You can sing songs with rhymes in such as Old Macdonald or Five Little Ducks. You can add toy animals to bath time play and count them. You can read the story "Dear Zoo" and talk about the different animals in the story and where they live. You can enjoy the lovely weather and go for a walk and look for different animals when out and about.
