#### Pre-School Room

The children in the Pre school room have been continuing to learn about Autumn. They have learnt about the fruits that grow on the trees such as conkers, berries and acorns and developed their math's skills by creating patterns with them. They have talked about Harvest and why we celebrate Harvest, We have also been enjoying taking part in Halloween week and creating decorations for the nursery. We have developed our fine motor skills by playing with Autumn scented playdough. This type of activity will help to develop our fine motor skills that support being able to hold a pencil correctly. We have also made leaf figures using leaves that they have found outside. We have also used torches to observe natural objects such as leaves and feathers .

#### Toddler Room

The Toddlers have been reading the story Owl Babies and based their activities on the story. They have turned the home corner into a vets and talked about taking care of the animals. They have made playdough and created owls using natural objects to add to the dough. They have talked about the dark and talked about being scared. They have played with the torches and created shadows.

#### Baby Room.

The babies have enjoyed lots of sensory play this month. They have explored lots of natural objects such as conkers, leaves and fir cones. They have taken part in creative activities such as sticking and painting with the leaves as well as creating some spooky Halloween decorations for the room.

### Things to do at home this month

#### Pre-School

The children in the pre school room are reading the book "Pumpkin Soup". You can talk to your child about their favourite flavour soup.
