#### Pre-School Room

The children in the pre school room have been learning about Autumn. They have enjoyed taking part in creative activities such as conker rolling and making Autumn garlands. They have developed their physical skills through squeezing and using tools in the Autumn scented playdough. They have also learnt about animals that hibernate and those that are nocturnal.

They enjoyed learning about Diwali and how it is celebrated. They have been on lots of Autumn walks around the local community looking for signs of Autumn. They used the opportunity to talk about road safety and keeping safe in the local community. They enjoyed making hedgehogs out of clay and making bird seed cakes whilst learning about looking after birds.

### Things to do at home this month

#### Pre-School

The children in the pre school room are taking part in activities about Fireworks and Bonfire Night. You can draw pictures of fireworks and talk about your child's favourite colour. You can also talk about the sounds the fireworks make. Listening to different sounds and distinguishing between them helps support your child's pre reading skills. You can make parkin and support your child's mathematical skills through measuring and counting as well as your developing your child's literacy skills following a recipe. You can also read our book of the month "Leaf Man".

#### Toddler room

The children in the toddler room are reading the book "Hedgehugs". You can talk to your child about hedgehogs and introduce new vocabulary such as prickles. The toddlers will also be focusing on the their personal, social and emotional development especially their turn taking skills. You can support this learning at home through playing games that involve turn taking such as pop up dragon. They are going to be learning about colours and you can take part at home by looking at books with colours in or painting pictures and naming the colours.

#### **Baby Room**

The children in the Baby room will be singing the song "Hickory Dickory Dock". You can sing the song at home and talk about the mouse. You can look at books with animals in and talk about the noises they make developing your child's language skills.

They are also going to be taking part in lots of outdoor play and learning about windy days. You can watch the trees blowing in the wind or watch washing on the line and talk about it blowing in the wind.
