Pre-School Room

This month in the pre-school room the children have been very busy we have been learning about things under the sea. For children to benefit as much as they can from cooking on camp fires, the area needs to be safe. We achieve this by following a careful camp fire procedure. Children are not allowed to go near the fire and will be kept away at a safe distance.

We are also reverting to our 6.00pm closing time, but would ask all parents to help us at this time and collect your children by 5.30pm if at all possible, so that our staff have time to thoroughly clean the nursery ready for the next day, without having to stay late on what are already very long days for them.

The guidance for nurseries has changed and we no longer have to work to bubbles, however we will continue to keep the children in small groups in line with the new guidance. We have found that keeping our 2 year old's in a separate group from the 3 and 4 year old's has been beneficial to both age groups, allowing us to be more focused on age appropriate activities. We have therefore decided to make this a permanent change.

Our new Pre and Post School Club will start on 7^h September. We will be dropping off and collecting the children from Woodhouse at the appropriate staggered start and finish time for each individual year group.

For the October half-term we will be starting a holiday club. The club is for school aged children up to the age of 11. The club will run between the hours of 7.30am and 6.00pm, and is limited to 10 children. If you would like further information or to book a place please contact Claire.
